# The Standards





The Victorian Protective Data Security Standards (VPDSS) were formally issued on 28<sup>th</sup> of July, 2016.

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## What is covered?

Any information obtained, received or held by an agency or body to which Part 4 of the Privacy and Data Protection Act (2014) applies.

This includes both hard and soft copy information, regardless of media or format!

**Directly in scope -**Applicable agencies or bodies set out under Part 4 of Privacy and Data Protection Act (PDPA) 2014




# Third party engagement

Applicable VPS organisations must ensure that any contractual arrangements or information sharing agreements (including Memorandum of Understandings) have the relevant protective data security requirements embedded into the terms or conditions of the agreement.





#### What does this mean for partner organisations?



- Under the VPDSS partner organisations do not need to provide CPDP a -
  - Security Risk Profile Assessment (SRPA), or
  - Protective Data Security Plan (PDSP)
- Given this, Standards 11 & 12 do not strictly apply to partner organisations

Instead, VPS agencies who are in scope for the VPDSF will require partner organisations provide a level of assurance on their protective data security practices.

Responses from partner organisations will inform the SRPA and PDSP of the VPS agency.

How VPS agencies will seek this assurance form their partners will differ, depending on the value of the information and the type of engagement or arrangement.
